According to Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (2007), a large percentage of senior nursing faculty members will retire over the next five years and half of the current nursing faculty members are likely to retire by 2016. As current Deans and Directors contemplate moving on, the nursing profession needs to focus on providing the next generation of academic administrators with the requisite knowledge and skills that will be needed to survive and thrive in academia. 
